

## **MsGinko WEBSITE COOKIES POLICY**

### **About cookies**

This website uses cookies. By using this website and agreeing to this policy, you consent to MsGinko's (an affiliate of Legacy Sàrl based in Versoix, Switzerland) use of cookies in accordance with the terms of this policy.

Cookies are files sent by web servers to web browsers, and stored by the web browsers.

The information is then sent back to the server each time the browser requests a page from the server. This enables a web server to identify and track web browsers.

There are two main kinds of cookies: session cookies and persistent cookies. Session cookies are deleted from your computer when you close your browser, whereas persistent cookies remain stored on your computer until deleted, or until they reach their expiry date.

### **Cookies and Logfile information**

MsGinko uses the following cookies on this website and logfile information for the following purposes:

- to personalize your experience on MsGinko;
- to identify and remember you, your web requests, your browser, your device, your IP address, the language you use, referring pages, exit pages and URLs, platform type, number of clicks, domain names, landing pages, pages you click on and the order you viewed those pages;
- to enhance your user experience, document the amount of time you spent on certain pages, dates and times of your activity, one or more cookies that may identify your browser, and status information;
- our servers log certain general information that our application sends whenever you access MsGinko, or if you update or request any information, including times and dates.

### **Google cookies**

MsGinko uses Google Analytics to analyse the use of this website. Google Analytics generates statistical and other information about website use by means of cookies, which are stored on users' computers. The information generated relating to our website is used to create reports about the use of the website. Google will store and use this information. ### **Refusing cookies**

Most browsers allow you to refuse to accept cookies. In Internet Explorer, you can refuse all cookies by clicking "Tools", "Internet Options", "Privacy", and selecting "Block all cookies" using the sliding selector.

In Firefox, you can adjust your cookies settings by clicking "Tools", "Options" and "Privacy". Blocking cookies will have a negative impact upon the usability of some websites.
